

The UPEI Centre for Education Research Invites You to its Christmas Social & Reflections on Research in Nunavut



Research shapes any context in multiple ways, some intentional, others serendipitous, a few potentially damaging. Engaging in ethically-based, reciprocally negotiated research within a Master of Education program delivered to Inuit women in Nunavut raised many difficult and complex issues.

In this presentation **Fiona Walton**, **Sandy McAuley**, and **Nunia Qanatsiaq** explore these issues while launching a **documentary video** about the program, *Lighting the Quqqiq: The First Master of Education Program in Nunavut*, directed by Mark Sandiford, and opening an **exhibition of photographs** of the graduates taken by **Carlos Reyes-Manzo**.

Combining celebration, critique, and arts-informed methodologies, this presentation problematizes and considers the role of participant-directed research within the power structures of post-colonial relationships.
