A temporary part time (0.4) music prep teacher is required by School District No. 60 (Peace River North) effective September 1, 2021 to June 30, 2022. The assignment will be at Anne Roberts Young Elementary School.

- Committed to a co-planning model within a learning "pod" of three to four divisions
- Willingness to share space and resources in a learning "pod" of three to four divisions within a flexible learning space environment
- Experience in and commitment to offering a personalized learning education program as outlined in the school information listed below
- Bachelor of Music degree or equivalent
- Ability to teach a musical instrument, dance, drama and/or choir
- Experience teaching music to elementary students and working collaboratively in a team teaching situation
- Current knowledge of and interest in applications of computer technology in the music classroom
- Working knowledge of the new curriculum to plan effectively
- Working knowledge of Performance Based Assessment, Balanced Literacy, Phonemic Awareness Development
- Working knowledge of current practice in teaching numeracy
- Ability to use performance standards in reading, writing, numeracy and social responsibility
- Committed to individualized instruction and group instruction utilizing a variety of effective strategies and techniques
- Ability to work as part of a team to develop and implement individualized learning plans for students with academic, social, emotional, and learning difficulties

Anne Roberts Young Elementary School was designed and built to facilitate a distinct learning environment. This process involved visitations to schools around the country, community consultation meetings and several design meetings with a cross-section of staff from around the district.
