# **Minimum Education Required**

Candidates must have or be working on a Master's degree\* from a recognized university in one of the following fields:

- Economics
- Public policy/administration
- International relations/studies
- Business administration in finance

\*CANDIDATES MUST SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETE THEIR MASTER'S DEGREE BY DECEMBER 31, 2022. Candidates hired will participate in the Economic and Social Sciences Services Developmental Program (ECDP).

### Specialization in economics

University coursework must include the equivalent of at least three full-year undergraduate or graduate courses in economics (or six half-year courses) by the time of graduation. Candidates who have a concentration in finance at the Master's degree level and three or more half-year post-secondary courses in economics will be considered.

### Academic excellence

Candidates must have obtained a grade point average (GPA) equivalent to 75 per cent or higher on their last completed Bachelor's degree.

Qualifications will be validated. You will be asked to provide copies of your transcripts at a later step in the assessment process.
