The successful candidates will assist in all aspects of the Island Nature Trust's Coastal Conservation project for the 2024 season. This project works to conserve the Piping Plover and Bank Swallow population across PEI.

- Assist with the timely and accurate collection and management of data essential to the program
- Assist with all outreach and education efforts related to the program
